**NORTH AMERICAN BILLING AND COLLECTION, INC., (NBANC) SUBMITS

ADMINISTRATION'S CONTRIBUTION FACTOR AND FUND SIZE FOR
MARCH 2000 THROUGH JUNE 2001**

On May 5, 2000, North American Billing and Collection, Inc., (NBANC), submitted a revised contribution factor and fund size estimate for funding the North American Numbering Plan Administrator for the period March 2000 through June 2001.¹

On December 30, 1999, the Network Services Division authorized the 2000 funding year contribution factor of 0.0000577 to be applied to the end-user revenue of each telecommunications carrier in the United States.² The current submission updates the contribution factor and fund size to reflect recent decisions by the Commission in the Numbering Resource Optimization (NRO) *Order* regarding the implementation of thousands-block number pooling, audits, and mandatory reporting of utilization and forecast data.³ In light of those decisions, NBANC is seeking approval of a revised contribution factor of 0.000043.

Interested parties may file comments concerning this matter on or before June 6, 2000, and reply comments on or before June 13, 2000.
