ORDER

By the Chief, Market Disputes Resolution Division, Enforcement Bureau:

1. This matter comes before the Commission on a Joint Motion To Dismiss With Prejudice (Joint Motion) filed by AT&T Corp. (AT&T) and BellSouth Telecommunications, Inc. (BellSouth).

2. Although the above-captioned proceedings are consolidated and involve numerous carriers, the Joint Motion pertains exclusively to the proceedings between AT&T and BellSouth. The above-captioned formal complaint and the supplemental complaint for damages address BellSouth's application of carrier common line charges to certain optional calling services.

3. We are satisfied that dismissing the complaints with prejudice will serve the public interest by promoting the private resolution of disputes and by eliminating the need for further litigation and the expenditure of further time and resources of the parties and of this Commission.

4. Accordingly, IT IS ORDERED, pursuant to sections 1, 4(i), 4(j), 201(b), and 208 of the Communications Act of 1934, as amended, 47 U.S.C. §§ 151, 154(i), 154(j), and 208, and the authority delegated in sections 0.111 and 0.311 of the Commission's rules, 47 C.F.R. §§ 0.111, 0.311, that the parties' Joint Motion to Dismiss With Prejudice IS GRANTED WITH PREJUDICE.

5. IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the above-captioned complaint (*i.e.*, E-95-10) IS DISMISSED WITH PREJUDICE and that this proceeding is TERMINATED.

6. IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the above-captioned supplemental complaint for damages (*i.e.*, E-99-15S) solely as it pertains to AT&T's claims against BellSouth IS DISMISSED WITH PREJUDICE and that this proceeding is TERMINATED.¹
