## **ORDER**

By the Accounting Policy Division, Common Carrier Bureau:

- 1. The Common Carrier Bureau (Bureau) has under consideration the above-captioned requests for review of decisions issued by the Schools and Libraries Division of the Universal Service Administrative Company (Administrator). These requests seek review of decisions issued by the Schools and Libraries Division of the Universal Service Administrative Company (Administrator).
