NOTICE OF PROPOSED RULE MAKING

By the Chief, Allocations Branch:

1. The Commission has before it the petition for rule making filed by Campbell River Broadcasting, LLC ("petitioner"), requesting the allotment of Channel 254C1 to Hawthorne, Nevada, as the community's second local FM allotment Petitioner states that it will apply for the channel, if allotted.

2. We believe petitioner's proposal warrants consideration since the allotment of Channel 254C1 at Hawthorne could provide the community with a wide coverage area FM service. Channel 254C1 can be allotted to the community in compliance with the Commission's minimum distance separation requirements without the imposition of a site restriction.¹ On our own motion, we are also optionally proposing to delete unoccupied and unapplied-for Channel 228A at Hawthorne unless an interest in activating the channel is expressed during the initial comment period.² A construction permit had been issued to Hawthorne FM Partnership, BPH-19981120MO, but was cancelled on July 25, 1996. While a new application filing window for Channel 228A has not been opened, it is Commission policy not to retain or allot new channels if there is no interest in use of the frequency. See, Hollis, Oklahoma, 11 FCC Rcd 10472 (1996), 11 FCC Rcd 14561 (1996).

3. Accordingly, we seek comments on the proposed amendment of the FM Table of Allotments, Section 73.202(b) of the Commission's Rules, for the community listed below, to read as

For purposes of this restricted notice and comment rule making proceeding, members of the public are advised that no <u>ex parte</u> presentations are permitted from the time the Commission adopts a Notice of Proposed Rule Making until the proceeding has been decided and such decision is no longer subject to reconsideration by the Commission or review by any court. An <u>ex parte</u> presentation is not prohibited if specifically requested by the Commission or staff for the clarification or adduction of evidence or resolution of issues in the proceeding. However, any new

written information elicited from such a request or a summary of any new oral information shall be served by the person making the presentation upon the other parties to the proceeding unless the Commission specifically waives this service requirement. Any comment which has not been served on the petitioner constitutes an <u>ex parte</u> presentation and shall not be

considered in the proceeding. Any reply comment which has not been served on the person(s) who filed the comment, to which the reply is directed, constitutes an <u>ex parte</u> presentation and shall not be considered in the proceeding.

APPENDIX

1. Pursuant to authority found in Sections 4(i), 5(c)(1), 303(g) and (r), and 307(b) of the Communications Act of 1934, as amended, and Sections 0.61, 0.204(b) and 0.283 of the Commission's Rules, IT IS PROPOSED TO AMEND the FM Table of Allotments, Section 73.202(b) of the Commission's Rules and Regulations, as set forth in the <u>Notice of Proposed Rule Making</u> to which this Appendix is attached.

2. <u>Showings Required</u>. Comments are invited on the proposal(s) discussed in the <u>Notice of</u> <u>Proposed Rule Making</u> to which this Appendix is attached. Proponent(s) will be expected to answer whatever questions are presented in initial comments. The proponent of a proposed allotment is also expected to file comments even if it only resubmits or incorporates by reference its former pleadings. It should also restate its present intention to apply for the channel if it is allotted and, if authorized, to build a station promptly. Failure to file may lead to denial of the request.

3. <u>Cut-off protection</u>. The following procedures will govern the consideration of filings in this proceeding.

(a) Counterproposals advanced in this proceeding itself will be considered, if advanced in initial comments, so that parties may comment on them in reply comments. They will not be considered if advanced in reply comments. (See Section 1.420(d) of the Commission's Rules).

(b) With respect to petitions for rule making which conflict with the proposals in this <u>Notice</u>, they will be considered as comments in the proceeding, and Public Notice to this effect will be given as long as they are filed before the date for filing initial comments herein. If they are filed later than that, they will not be considered in connection with the decision in this docket.

(c) The filing of a counterproposal may lead the Commission to allot a different channel than was requested for any of the communities involved.

4. <u>Comments and Reply Comments; Service</u>. Pursuant to applicable procedures set out in Sections 1.415 and 1.420 of the Commission's Rules and Regulations, interested parties may file comments and reply comments on or before the dates set forth in the <u>Notice of Proposed Rule Making</u> to which this Appendix is attached. All submissions by parties to this proceeding or by persons acting on behalf of such parties must be made in written comments, reply comments, or other appropriate pleadings. Comments shall be served on the petitioner by the person filing the comments. Reply comments and reply comments shall be accompanied by a certificate of service. (See Section 1.420(a), (b) and (c) of the Commission's Rules.) Comments should be filed with the Secretary, Federal Communications Commission, Washington, D.C. 20554.

5. <u>Number of Copies</u>. In accordance with the provisions of Section 1.420 of the Commission's Rules and Regulations, an original and four copies of all comments, reply comments, pleadings, briefs,

or other documents shall be furnished the Commission.
