THE WIRELESS TELECOMMUNICATIONS BUREAU ANNOUNCES THAT IT IS PREPARED TO GRANT 959 LICENSES TO OPERATE IN THE 39 GHZ BAND (Balance of Winning Bids are due by August 30, 2000)

On June 28, 2000, six long-form applications (FCC Form 601) for the authority to operate in the 38.6-40.0 GHz (39 GHz) band were placed on public notice as accepted for filing. On July 21, 2000, twenty-one long-form applications for the authority to operate in the 39 GHz band were placed on public notice as accepted for filing. Upon review of these twenty-seven long-form applications, the Wireless Telecommunications Bureau is prepared to grant the thirteen long-form applications for 104 licenses that are listed in the Attachment. These grants will occur upon the full and timely payment of the remaining balance of the applicant's winning bid(s) by August 30, 2000, which is ten business days after the date of this public notice. Final disposition of the fourteen remaining applications will be noted in future public notices and/or orders.

Note that the Commission's Part 1 competitive bidding rules also provide an additional ten business day grace period for applicants who fail to meet the initial ten business day payment deadline.³ Under Section 1.2109(a), applicants who fail to meet the initial ten business day deadline are given an additional ten business days in which to pay, provided they also pay a late fee equal to five percent of the amount due.⁴ Applicants listed in the Attachment who do not submit the required payment by the late payment deadline of September 14, 2000, will be considered in default and are subject to automatic license

cancellation and additional default payments.⁵ Should an applicant default, it will be subject to a payment equal to the difference between the amount bid and the amount of the winning bid the next time the license is offered by the Commission.⁶

In addition, defaulting applicants will be subject to a default payment of three percent of the subsequent winning bid or three percent of the defaulting bid, whichever is less. These amounts will be deducted from any remaining upfront payments or down payments that the defaulting or disqualified applicant has on deposit with the Commission. If the default occurs within ten business days after the bidding has closed, the Commission retains the discretion to offer the license to the other bidders in descending order of their bid amounts at the final bid levels.

Issuance of Individual Licenses

Following the timely payment of the balance of the applicant's winning bid amount(s), the Commission will issue individual license(s) for each market to the applicant(s) listed in Attachment A.

PAYMENT INSTRUCTIONS

Final payments. All applicants identified in Attachment A must submit the balance of their winning bids in lump sum payments to Mellon Bank by August 30, 2000.

Method of payment. All payments must be in U.S. dollars and made in the form of a wire transfer. No personal checks, credit card payments, or other forms of payment will be accepted. **All payments must be accompanied by a completed FCC Remittance Advice Form (FCC Form 159).** A partially completed copy of the FCC Form 159 will be sent to each applicant on August 16, 2000 to facilitate submission of the correct remaining balance of the winning bid(s). Applicants listed on Attachment A who have not received the partially completed FCC Form 159 by August 18, 2000 should contact Gail Glasser at 202-418-1995. **However, each applicant is ultimately responsible for the verification and submission of the correct balance due.**

Wire transfer payments must be received by Mellon Bank by 6:00 p.m. Eastern Time, on Wednesday, August 30, 2000. Applicants should coordinate with their bankers ahead of time regarding their wire transfers, and allow sufficient time for the wire transfer to be initiated and completed prior to the deadline. To submit funds by wire transfer, applicants will need the following information:
