ORDER

By the Accounting Policy Division, Common Carrier Bureau:

- 1. The Accounting Policy Division (Division) has under consideration a request for review filed by Brooklyn Public Library, Brooklyn, New York. The request for review seeks review of a decision issued by the Schools and Libraries Division of the Universal Service Administrative Company (Administrator).
- 2. The Commission's rules provide that the Common Carrier Bureau (Bureau) must issue a decision resolving a request for review of matters properly before it within ninety days unless the time period is extended.³ On August 18, 2000, the Bureau extended by thirty days the time period for considering Brooklyn Public Library's request for review.⁴ The Bureau requires additional time to review the issues presented. Accordingly, we extend by an additional thirty

(30) days the deadline by which the Bureau must take action regarding Brooklyn Public Library's request for review.

3. Accordingly, IT IS ORDERED, pursuant to section 54.724 of the Commission's rules, 47 C.F.R. § 54.724, that the time period for taking action on the request for review filed by Brooklyn Public Library, Brooklyn, New York IS EXTENDED BY thirty days from the original ninety-day deadline, to October 16, 2000.
