## PLEADING CYCLE ESTABLISHED FOR COMMENTS FOR APPLICATIONS OF NECADACOM FOR REVIEW

CC Docket No. 00-21

Released: November 21, 2000

On May 26, 2000, Nevadacom, Inc. (Nevadacom) filed an application for review requesting review by the Commission of action taken by the Common Carrier Bureau (Bureau) pursuant to delegated authority. Specifically, Nevadacom requests review of the April 26, 2000 Order by the Bureau in CC Docket No. 00-21, *Petition of Nevadacom for Expedited Declaratory Ruling that Telegraphic Money Order Service is an Information (Enhanced) service and No subject to State Regulation (Nevadacom Order)*. The *Nevadacom Order* denied without prejudice Nevadacom's petition and terminated the proceeding.

Nevadacom states that the Bureau abused its discretion and committed prejudicial procedural error when it dismissed Nevadacom's petition.

Interested parties may file comments regarding the Nevadacom application for review no later than **December 20, 2000**, with Magalie Roman Salas, Office of the Secretary, 445 12<sup>th</sup> Street, SW, Room TW-B204, Washington, DC 20554. Opposition or responses to these comments may be filed with the Secretary, FCC no later than **January 4, 2001**. All pleadings are to reference **CC Docket No. 00-21**. Interested parties should file an **original and seven copies** of all pleadings. An additional copy of all pleadings must be sent to Janice M. Myles, Common Carrier Bureau, FCC, Room 5-C327, 445 12<sup>th</sup> Street, SW, Washington, DC 20554, and to the Commission's contractor for public services records duplication, International Transcription Services, Inc. (ITS), 445 12<sup>th</sup> Street, SW, Room CY-B402, Washington, DC 20554. The Nevadacom application for review is available for inspection and copying during normal business hours in the FCC's Reference Center, Room CY-A257, and 445 12<sup>th</sup> Street, SW, TW-A325, Washington, DC 20554. Copies also can be obtained for ITS at 445 12<sup>th</sup> Street, SW, Room CY-B402, Washington DC 20554 or by calling ITS at (202) 857-3800 or faxing ITS at (202) 857-3805.

Comments filed through the ECFS can be sent as an electronic file via the Internet to <http://www.fcc.gov/e-file/ecfs.html>. Generally, only one copy of an electronic submission must be filed. If multiple docket or rulemaking numbers appear in the caption of this proceeding, however, commenters must transmit one electronic copy of the comments to each docket or rulemaking number referenced in the caption. In completing the transmittal screen, commenters should include their full name, U.S. Postal Service mailing address, and the applicable docket or rulemaking number. Parties may also submit an electronic comment by Internet e-mail. To get filing instructions for e-mail comments, commenters should send an e-mail to [ecfs@fcc.gov](mailto:ecfs@fcc.gov), and should include the following words in the body of the message, "get form <your e-mail address>." A sample form and directions will be sent in reply.

We will treat this proceeding as “permit but disclose” for purposes of the Commission's *ex parte* rules. *See* 47 C.F.R. §§ 1.1200, 1.1206. Parties making oral *ex parte* presentations are reminded that memoranda summarizing the presentations must contain summaries of the substance of the presentation and not merely a listing of the subjects discussed. More than a one or two sentence description of the views and arguments presented is generally required. *See* 47 C.F.R. § 1.1206(b)(2) as revised. Other rules pertaining to oral and written presentations are set forth in section 1.1206(b) as well. Interested parties are to file with the Secretary, FCC, and serve Janice M Myles, and ITS, with copies of any written *ex parte* presentations of summaries of oral *ex parte* presentations in these proceeding in the manner specified above.
