GTE Service Corporation's Motion for Extension of Time Is Granted

CCB/CPD 00-05

On March 16, 2000, GTE Service Corporation (GTE) filed a motion for extension of time to allow it additional time to address several issues proposed by the F.C.C.'s *Order Designating Issues for Investigation (Order)*.¹ GTE states that notwithstanding the magnitude of material it was asked to present, the *Order* provides less than 3 weeks for GTE to file its Direct Case. GTE believes that a two day extension period is in the public interest and that a short extension should not harm other parties. GTE also believes that the extension should not jeopardize the ability of the Commission to evaluate the material in a timely manner. On March 17, 2000, for the above-stated reasons, the Competitive Pricing Division of the Common Carrier Bureau granted the motion filed by GTE.
