On December 14, 1999, Satelites Mexicanos, S.A. de C.V. ("Satmex") filed a letter requesting the Commission to add the three satellites listed below to the "Permitted Space Station" list created by the Commission in the DISCO II First Reconsideration Order. Satmex notes that the Commission has previously authorized certain U.S. earth station operators to communicate with these satellites. See, e.g., FCC Grants 16 Earth Station Licenses for Foreign-Licensed Satellite Systems to Operate in the United States Under New Rules Implementing 1997 WTO Agreement, Public Notice, Report No. DS-1864, Public Notice (released July 29, 1998).
