ORDER ON RECONSIDERATION

By the Chief, Enforcement Bureau:

- 1. In this Order, we deny reconsideration of our February 17, 2000 Order, which denied the complaint in this matter. Genesis Communications International, Inc. (Genesis) largely reiterates arguments that we previously fully considered and rejected and has not otherwise shown that we should reconsider our Order. Reconsideration will not be granted merely for the purpose of again debating matters on which the agency has once deliberated and spoken.²
- 2. Under Section 405 of the Communications Act of 1934, as amended, we have discretion to grant reconsideration of an order "if sufficient reason therefor be made to appear." Genesis has not shown that we should do so here. We therefore deny its petition for reconsideration of our Order.
