ORDER

By the Chief, Consumer Protection and Competition Division, Cable Services Bureau:

1. The Communications Workers of America (“CWA”) filed the above-captioned complaint against AT&T Broadband LLC regarding alleged violations pursuant to Part 76 of the Commission’s public file rules. AT&T has filed a Motion For Extension of Time seeking a thirty (30) day extension until May 9, 2001 in which to file its opposition to CWA’s complaint. AT&T asserts that good cause exists for granting this request because it will enable AT&T to submit a full and accurate filing so that the Commission can proceed with a complete record before it. CWA has not opposed AT&T’s extension request.¹

2. AT&T’s Motion for Extension of Time is granted. Accordingly, AT&T’s opposition to CWA’s complaint regarding alleged violations of Part 76 of the Commission’s public file rules is due May 9, 2001.
