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## WIRELESS TELECOMMUNICATIONS BUREAU SEEKS COMMENT ON REQUEST FOR WAIVER OF AIRCRAFT STATION IDENTIFICATION REQUIREMENT

Comment Date: March 27, 2002 Reply Date: April 3, 2002

On February 26, 2002, the Great Lakes Region of the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) requested an exemption from the Commission's Part 87 Rules to specify a standard form of station identification for aircraft being operated by maintenance personnel as these personnel move the aircraft from one location to another location at the airport. Section 87.107(a) of the Commission's Rules specifies the permissible means by which aircraft stations may identify themselves. Section 87.107(a)(3) provides that station identification may consist of the type of aircraft followed by the characters of the registration marking ("N" number) of the aircraft, omitting the prefix letter "N." Additionally, when a ground station initiates communication, an aircraft station may use as its station identification the type of aircraft followed by the last three letters of the registration marking.

The FAA states that problems have arisen recently with respect to communications between air traffic ground controllers and aircraft maintenance personnel as the personnel move aircraft within an airport. According to the FAA, these problems stem from the absence of a standard form of station identification for aircraft operated by maintenance personnel, and have resulted in "runway incursions." The FAA, therefore, requests to use a station identification consisting of the company name, the word "maintenance" and the last three letters of the "N" number of the aircraft to identify aircraft that maintenance personnel are moving from one location to another location in the airport. For example, an appropriate station identification for an aircraft operated by maintenance personnel would be "United Maintenance 123 Uniform Alpha" in lieu of "Boeing November 123 Uniform Alpha." The FAA states

that granting this request would improve airport safety by simplifying communications with air traffic control, allowing air traffic controllers to ascertain that a maintenance person is operating the aircraft instead of a pilot, and reducing runway incursions caused by maintenance technicians.<sup>8</sup>

We will treat the FAA Request for an exemption as a request for a waiver of Section 87.107(a)(3) of the Commission's Rules. Interested parties may file comments on the waiver request on or before March 21, 2002. Parties interested in submitting reply comments must do so on or before March 28, 2002. Because of the policy implications and potential impact of this proceeding on persons not parties to the waiver request, we believe it would be in the public interest to treat this case as a permit-but-disclose proceeding under the *ex parte* rules. *See* Sections 1.1200(a) and 1.1206 of the Commission's Rules, 47 C.F.R. §§ 1.1200(a) and 1.1206. Therefore, after the release of this *Public Notice*, *ex parte* presentations that are made on the issues involved in the subject Waiver Request will be allowed but must be disclosed in accordance with the requirements of Section 1.1206(b) of the Commission's Rules, 47 C.F.R. § 1.1206(b).
