Unless otherwise specified, the following procedures apply to the applications listed below:

The application listed below has been found, upon initial review, to be acceptable for filing. This application is not subject to the streamlined processing procedures set forth in section 63.12 of the Commission's rules, 47 C.F.R. § 63.12. This application shall not be deemed granted until the Commission affirmatively acts upon the application. Operation for which authorization is sought may not commence except in accordance with any terms or conditions imposed by the Commission.

Interested parties may file comments with respect to this application within **21 days** of the date of this public notice, and Applicants may file replies within **7 days** thereafter. We request that such comments and replies refer to the application file number shown below. *Ex parte* communications between outside parties and Commission staff concerning this application are permitted subject to the Commission's rules for the "permit-but-disclose proceedings." Services: Global International Facilities-Based and Resale Services

Application for authority to provide service in accordance with the provisions of section 63.18 (e)(1) and (2) of the Commission's rules, specifically: (1) authority to provide global international facilities-based service between all points in both, Georgia and Louisiana and all international points, except countries listed on the Commission's exclusion list; and (2) authority to provide global resale services between all points in both Georgia and Louisiana and all international points. Pursuant to section 63.10 of the Commission's rules, Applicant requests non-dominant treatment for all routes.

This application covers traffic originating in the states of Georgia and Louisiana, which are "in-region" states of BellSouth Corporation. Applicant requests grant of this application at the same time that BellSouth Corporation is legally permitted to provide in-region interLATA service in the states of Georgia and Louisiana under section 271 of the Communications Act of 1934, as amended, 47 U.S.C. § 271. Commenters should limit their comments in this proceeding to issues specific to the requests of BellSouth Long Distance for authorization under section 214 to provide international service. Issues related to whether BellSouth Long Distance has met the criteria under section 271 for entry into interLATA services in the states of Georgia and Louisiana will be addressed in the context of the pending section 271 application for those states. See Comments Requested on the joint Application by BellSouth Corporation, BellSouth Telecommunications, Inc., and BellSouth Long Distance for Authorization under section 271 of the Communications Act to Provide In-region, interLATA Service in the States of Georgia and Louisiana, CC Docket No. 02-35, Public Notice, DA-02-337 (rel. February 14, 2002).
