## WIRELINE COMPETITION BUREAU GRANTS CONSENT FOR A TRANSFER OF CONTROL OF COAST TO COAST TELECOMMUNICATIONS, INC. FROM RIVIEN USA, L.L.C. TO ALLEGIANCE TELECOM

Pursuant to section 214 of the Communications Act of 1934, as amended, 47 U.S.C. § 214, and sections 0.91, 0.291, and 63.01 of the Commission's rules, 47 C.F.R. §§ 0.91, 0.291, and 63.01, the Wireline Competition Bureau (Bureau) approves the application for transfer of control of Coast to Coast Telecommunications, Inc. ("Coast to Coast") from Rivien USA, L.L.C. to Allegiance Telecom. Coast to Coast is a common carrier authorized to provide domestic telecommunications services pursuant to blanket section 214 authorization. No comments or petitions to deny were received in response to the public notice announcing that the application had been accepted for filing. <sup>1</sup>

The Bureau finds, upon consideration of the record, that the proposed transfer will serve the public interest, convenience and necessity, and therefore grants the requested authorization.
