**PLEADING CYCLE ESTABLISHED FOR COMMENTS ON
SECTION 272(B)(1)'S "OPERATE INDEPENDENTLY" REQUIREMENT
FOR SECTION 272 AFFILIATES**

On November 4, 2003, the Commission released a Notice of Proposed Rulemaking (NPRM) seeking comment on whether the Commission should modify the rules adopted to implement section 272(b)(1)'s "operate independently" requirement. Specifically, it seeks comment on whether the operating, installation, and maintenance sharing prohibition is an overbroad means of preventing cost misallocation or discrimination by Bell Operating Companies (BOCs) against unaffiliated rivals. The NPRM also seeks comment on whether the prohibition against joint ownership by BOCs and their section 272 affiliates of switching and transmission facilities, or the land and buildings on which such facilities are located, should be modified or eliminated. A summary of the Commission's NPRM was published in the Federal Register on November 21, 2003, triggering the cycle for comments and reply comments on the NPRM. (68 FR 65665, November 21, 2003)

Due to the intervening Thanksgiving holiday during the comment cycle, we grant, on our own motion, a limited extension of the deadline for filing comments and reply comments in this proceeding. Although it is the policy of the Commission that extensions of time are not routinely granted, the Bureau finds that there is good cause for an extension in this instance. Accordingly, interested parties may now file comments on or before December 10, 2003 and reply comments on or before December 22, 2003.

This matter shall be treated as a "permit-but-disclose" proceeding in accordance with the Commission's *ex parte* rules. See 47 C.F.R. §§ 1.1200, 1.1206. Persons making oral *ex parte* presentations are reminded that memoranda summarizing the presentations must contain summaries of the substance of the presentations and not merely a listing of the subjects discussed. More than a one or two sentence description of the views and arguments presented generally is required. See 47 C.F.R. § 1.1206(b). Other rules pertaining to oral and written *ex parte* presentations in permit-but-disclose proceedings are set forth in section 1.1206(b) of the Commission's rules, 47 C.F.R. § 1.1206(b).

Pursuant to Section 1.415 and 1.419 of the Commission's rules, 47 C.F.R. §§ 1.415, 1.419, interested parties may file comments on or before **December 10, 2003** and reply comments on or before **December 22, 2003**. Comments may be filed using the Commission's Electronic Comment Filing System (ECFS) or by filing paper copies. See Electronic Filing of Documents in Rulemaking Proceedings, 63 Fed. Reg. 24121 (1998). Comments filed through the ECFS can be sent as an electronic file via the Internet to <<http://www.fcc.gov/e-file/ecfs.html>>. Generally, only one copy of an electronic submission must be filed. If multiple docket or rulemaking numbers appear in the caption of this proceeding, however, commenters must transmit one electronic copy of the comments to each docket or rulemaking number referenced in the caption. In completing the transmittal screen, commenters should include their full name, U.S. Postal Service mailing address, and the applicable docket or rulemaking number. Parties may also submit an electronic comment by Internet e-mail. To get filing instructions for e-mail comments, commenters should send an e-mail to ecfs@fcc.gov, and should include the following words in the body of the message, "get form <your e-mail address>." A sample form and directions will be sent in reply.

Parties who choose to file by paper must file an original and four copies of each filing. If more than one docket or rulemaking number appear in the caption of this proceeding, commenters must submit two additional copies for each additional docket or rulemaking number.

Filings can be sent by hand or messenger delivery, by commercial overnight courier, or by first-class or overnight U.S. Postal Service mail (although we continue to experience delays in receiving U.S. Postal Service mail).
