By the Telecommunications Access Policy Division, Wireline Competition Bureau:

1. Before the Telecommunications Access Policy Division is a Request for Review filed by the Milwaukee Public Schools (Milwaukee PS), Milwaukee, Wisconsin, seeking review of decisions by the Schools and Libraries Division (SLD) of the Universal Service Administrative Company (Administrator) to deny funding.¹ On January 12, 2004, Milwaukee PS requested that its Request for Review be withdrawn.²
