ORDER

By the Telecommunications Access Policy Division, Wireline Competition Bureau:

- 1. The Telecommunications Access Policy Division has under consideration a Request for Waiver filed by Coleman Community Schools, Coleman, Michigan (Coleman). ¹ Coleman requests a waiver of the Commission's rules governing the schools and libraries universal service support mechanism, specifically, the 28-day competitive bidding requirement. ² For the reasons set forth below, we deny the Waiver Request.
- 2. The record shows that Coleman's FCC Form 470 was posted on SLD's website on January 23, 2003. This created an allowable contract date of February 20, 2003. Despite the clear requirements of our rules that applicants may not sign the FCC Form 471 before the allowable contract date, Coleman dated the form on January 29, 2003, several weeks prior to the allowable contract date of February 20, 2003. Coleman does not deny that the FCC Form 471 was signed prior to the allowable contract date, but states that they were instructed by the SLD

help line to submit the FCC Form 471 before the filing window closed, and request a waiver of the Commission's rules.⁶

- 3. Upon review of the record, we conclude that a waiver is not appropriate. A waiver from the Commission is appropriate if special circumstances warrant a deviation from the general rule and such deviation would better serve the public interest than strict adherence to the general rule. A signature date on an FCC Form 471 or on a service provider agreement that predates the expiration of the 28-day posting period indicates that the applicant failed to wait 28 days before entering into an agreement with a service provider and therefore violated the Commission's competitive bidding rules. The Wireline Competition Bureau has consistently denied requests for review by applicants that have violated the Commission's competitive bidding rules by signing the FCC Form 471 before the allowable contract date.
- 4. In light of the thousands of applications that SLD must review and process each year, we find that it is administratively necessary to require an applicant to be responsible for carefully following program rules. Further, the Commission has consistently held that it is the applicant who has responsibility ultimately for the timely submission of the application. Coleman's Request for Waiver is therefore denied.
