By the Acting Associate Chief, Public Safety and Critical Infrastructure Division, Wireless Telecommunications Bureau:

1. The Public Safety and Critical Infrastructure Division (Division) has under consideration the above-captioned Motion.¹ On November 20, 2003, OnStar Corporation (OnStar) filed a Petition for Clarification.² On February 11, 2004, OnStar filed the Motion to Withdraw its Petition. The Division grants OnStar’s Withdrawal Motion and, therefore, dismisses its Petition.
