By the Telecommunications Access Policy Division, Wireline Competition Bureau:

1. The Telecommunications Access Policy Division has under consideration a Request for Waiver filed by Anaheim City School District, Anaheim, California (Anaheim City).¹ Anaheim City seeks waiver for the FCC Form 472 filing deadline in relation to requests for discounts made by Anaheim City in Funding Year 2000 of the schools and libraries universal service mechanism.² Specifically, Anaheim City requests that the deadline be extended for Funding Request Number (FRN) 876693.³ Upon our review of the record, however, we find that the Schools and Libraries Division approved Anaheim City's request to extend the invoicing deadline for FRN 876693.⁴ Accordingly, Anaheim City's Request for Waiver is dismissed as moot.
