By the Chief, Telecommunications Access Policy Division:

1. On December 18, 1998, SBC Communications Inc. (SBC) filed a Petition for Clarification and Reconsideration (Petition) in the above-captioned proceeding.¹ In its petition, SBC sought clarification and reconsideration of the Commission's Fifth Universal Service Report and Order.² On April 7, 2004, SBC submitted a request to withdraw the Petition.³ We grant the request to withdraw and dismiss the Petition.
