**Comment Sought To Refresh Record  
On Carrier Identification Code (CIC) Conservation and Definition of “Entity”  
For Purposes of CIC Assignments**

**CC Docket No. 92-237**

**Comments Due: 30 days after Federal Register publication of this Notice**  
**Reply Comments Due: 45 days after Federal Register publication of this Notice**

Interested parties are invited to refresh the record on issues raised in the Further Notice of Proposed Rulemaking in the above docket related to carrier identification code (CIC) conservation and the definition of “entity” as found in Section 1.3 of the CIC Assignment Guidelines.<sup>1</sup>

Specifically, we invite interested parties, in light of any changed circumstances, to respond to questions in the *CIC Further Notice* regarding the two CIC per entity limit,<sup>2</sup> and proposed changes to the definition of the term “entity.”<sup>3</sup>

Parties submitting comments in response to this Public Notice must file initial comments no later than **30 days after this Public Notice appears in the Federal Register** and reply comments no later than **45 days after such publication**. All pleadings are to reference **CC Docket No. 92-237**. Comments may be filed using: (1) the Commission’s Electronic Comment Filing System (ECFS), (2) the Federal Government’s eRulemaking Portal, or (3) by filing paper copies. See *Electronic Filing of Documents in Rulemaking Proceedings*, 63 FR 24121 (1998).

Comments filed through the ECFS can be sent as an electronic file via the Internet to <http://www.fcc.gov/cgb/ecfs/>. Generally, only one copy of an electronic submission must be filed. If multiple docket or rulemaking numbers appear in the caption of this proceeding, however, commenters must transmit one electronic copy of the comments to each docket or rulemaking number referenced in

the caption. In completing the transmittal screen, commenters should include their full name, U.S. Postal Service mailing address, and the applicable docket or rulemaking number. Parties may also submit an electronic comment by Internet e-mail. To get filing instructions for e-mail comments, commenters should send an e-mail to [ecfs@fcc.gov](mailto:ecfs@fcc.gov), and should include the following words in the body of the message, "get form." A sample form and directions will be sent in reply. Parties who choose to file by paper must file an original and four copies of each filing. If more than one docket or rulemaking number appears in the caption of this proceeding, commenters must submit two additional copies for each additional docket or rulemaking number.

Parties who choose to file by paper must file an original and four copies of each filing.
