NPSPAC 800 MHz REGIONAL PUBLIC SAFETY PLANNING MEETING (GEN. DOCKET NO. 91-228)

The Region 54 (Southern Lake Michigan) Public Safety Regional Planning Committees announce two consecutive Region 54 public safety planning meetings:

- On Monday, June 20, 2005, the 700 MHz Public Safety Regional Planning Committee will be held at 10:00 a.m. at the Chicago Office of Emergency Communications at 1411 West Madison Street, Chicago, Illinois. The purpose of the meeting is to finalize the Region 54 700 MHz draft plan.
- Beginning at 1:00 p.m., the Region 54 800 MHz Public Safety Regional Planning Committee will convene at 1:00 p.m. The purpose of the meeting is to hold a 800 MHz Rebanding Q&A session with representatives from NEXTEL.

Both of the Region 54 Public Safety Planning Committee meetings are open to the public. All eligible public safety providers in Region 54 whose sole or principal purpose is to protect the safety of life, health, or property may utilize these frequencies. It is essential that not only public safety, but all government, Native American Tribal, and non-governmental organizations eligible under Section 90.523 of the Commission's Rules be represented in order to ensure that each agency's future spectrum needs are considered in the allocation process. Administrators who are not oriented in the communications field should delegate someone with this knowledge to attend, participate and represent your agency's needs.

All interested parties wishing to participate in the planning for the use of new public safety spectrum in the 700 MHz and 800 MHz band, or the newly allocated 4.9 GHz band within Region 54 are encouraged to attend. For further information about the meeting, please contact:
