7. Tyco presentation - Mr. Bob Speidel, Manager, Government Relations, Regulatory Policy
8. Work on 700 MHz plan structure.
9. Plan for future meetings.

The Region 25 (Montana) 700 MHz Public Safety Planning Committee meeting is open to the public. All eligible public safety providers whose sole purpose or principal purpose is to

protect the safety of life, health, or property in Region 25 would utilize these frequencies. It is essential that not only public safety, but all government, Native American Tribal, and non-governmental organizations eligible under Section 90.523 of the Commission's Rules be represented in order to ensure that each agency's future spectrum needs are considered in the allocation process. Administrators who are not oriented in the communications field should delegate someone with this knowledge to attend, participate and represent your agency's needs.
