SBC COMMUNICATIONS INC. AND AT&T CORP APPLICATIONS FOR TRANSFER OF CONTROL OF LICENSES AND AUTHORIZATIONS

NUMBERING RESOURCE UTILIZATION AND FORECAST (NRUF) REPORTS PLACED INTO THE RECORD, SUBJECT TO PROTECTIVE ORDER

SBC Communications Inc. ("SBC") and AT&T Corp. ("AT&T") (collectively, the "Applicants") have filed a series of applications pursuant to Sections 214 and 310(d) of the Communications Act of 1934, as amended (the "Communications Act"). In these applications, the Applicants generally seek Commission approval for the transfer of control to SBC of the licenses and authorizations held both directly and indirectly by AT&T. In connection with the Commission's review of the applications, the Commission intends to examine information contained in the Numbering Resource Utilization and Forecast ("NRUF") reports filed by wireless telecommunications carriers. These data may assist the Commission in assessing the competitive effects of the transaction. Accordingly, subject to the provisions of the Second Protective Order adopted in the merger proceeding, the Commission intends to place into the record a database containing NRUF data for all wireless telecommunications carriers within SBC's territories with data as of December 31, 2004.

Section 251 of the Communications Act grants the Commission jurisdiction over the North American Numbering Plan ("NANP") and related telephone numbering issues. In order to better monitor the way numbering resources are used within the NANP and efficiently allocate NANP resources, the Commission requires telecommunications carriers to provide the Commission with a utilization report of their current inventory of telephone numbers and a five-year forecast of their numbering resource requirements.⁴

The Commission has recognized that disaggregated, carrier-specific forecast and utilization data should be treated as confidential and should be exempt from public disclosure under 5 U.S.C. § 552(b)(4).⁵ The NRUF reports are being placed into the record subject to the provisions of a protective order. As such, the NRUF data will not be available to the public except pursuant to the terms of the protective order, as outlined below.

Persons seeking to review the NRUF data may do so only for purposes of participating in the merger proceeding. Pursuant to the Second Protective Order, outside counsel and outside consultants participating or intending to participate in the proceeding who are not involved in competitive decision-making activities and who have signed the Acknowledgement of Confidentiality attached to the Second Protective Order in the merger proceeding may review the NRUF data. We emphasize that persons seeking to review the NRUF data must have adequate protections in place to prevent improper use or disclosure of the information.

The Commission will place the NRUF data into the public record subject to the safeguards contained in the Second Protective Order. Affected parties will have five business days after the filing of an Acknowledgement of Confidentiality or, if an Acknowledgement of Confidentiality has already been filed, a request to review the data, to object to the release of the data to a particular person who requests permission to review it. If disclosure is opposed, the procedures set forth in 47 C.F.R. § 0.461(i) shall apply. All filings should refer to WC Docket No. 05-65 and CC Docket No. 99-200.

Under the Commission's current procedures for the submission of filings and other documents, ⁶ objections to release of the data and responses there to may be filed electronically (*i.e.*, though ECFS) or by hand delivery to the Commission's Massachusetts Avenue location.

- If filed by ECFS, ⁷ comments shall be sent as an electronic file via the Internet to http://www.fcc.gov/e-file/ecfs.html. In completing the transmittal screen, commenters should include their full name, Postal Service mailing address, and the applicable docket number. Parties may also submit an electronic comment by Internet e-mail.
