By the Deputy Chief, Policy Division, Media Bureau:

- 1. The City of Long Beach, California (the "City") by letter filed a Request for Extension of Time ("Request") to file a supplemental response to its conditional opposition to the Petition for Special Relief ("Petition") in the above-captioned matter filed by Charter Communications. The City requested additional time mainly to analyze additional information the City has requested from Charter. Charter states they have by letter informed the City that all relevant information is contained in its petition and that there is no additional information in Charter's possession. Charter asserts that the City's request for an extension until February 9, 2005 is unwarranted and prejudicial.
