## WIRELINE COMPETITION BUREAU SEEKS COMMENT ON TWO PETITIONS FOR DECLARATORY RULINGS CONCERNING UNIVERSAL SERVICE CONTRIBUTION OBLIGATIONS

WC Docket No. 06-122

By this Public Notice, parties are invited to comment on a petition filed by CTIA-The Wireless Association and a petition filed by Cingular Wireless LLC requesting declaratory rulings regarding certain aspects of the *2006 Contribution Methodology Reform Order*<sup>1</sup> and previous Commission and Bureau-level Orders.<sup>2</sup>

Interested parties may file **comments on or before September 11, 2006** and **reply comments on or before September 26, 2006**. All pleadings must reference WC Docket No. 06-122. Comments may be filed using: (1) the Commission's Electronic Comment Filing System (ECFS), (2) the Federal Government's eRulemaking Portal, or (3) by filing paper copies. See *Electronic Filing of Documents in Rulemaking Proceedings*, 63 FR 24121 (1998).

- Electronic Filers: Comments may be filed electronically using the Internet by accessing the ECFS: <http://www.fcc.gov/cgb/ecfs/> or the Federal eRulemaking Portal: <http://www.regulations.gov>. Filers should follow the instructions provided on the website for submitting comments.

In completing the transmittal screen, filers should include their full name, U.S. Postal Service mailing address, and the applicable docket or rulemaking number. This matter shall be treated as a "permit-but-disclose" proceeding in accordance with the Commission's *ex parte* rules.<sup>3</sup> Persons making oral *ex parte* presentations are reminded that memoranda summarizing the presentations must contain summaries of the substance of the presentation and not merely a listing of the subjects discussed. More than a one or two sentence description of the views and arguments presented generally is required.<sup>4</sup> Other rules pertaining to oral and written *ex parte* presentations in permit-but-disclose proceedings are set forth in section 1.1206(b) of the Commission's rules.<sup>5</sup>
