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WIRELINE COMPETITION BUREAU SEEKS COMMENT ON THE IDAHO PUBLIC UTILITIES COMMISSION AND THE ALABAMA PUBLIC SERVICE COMMISSION PETITIONS FOR DELEGATION OF AUTHORITY TO IMPLEMENT NUMBER CONSERVATION MEASURES

In this Notice, the Wireline Competition Bureau seeks comment on petitions filed by the Idaho Public Utilities Commission (Idaho Commission) and the Alabama Public Service Commission (Alabama Commission) for authority to implement number conservation measures. The Alabama Commission seeks delegated authority to implement thousands-block number pooling in the 256 Numbering Plan Area (NPA) to extend the life of the 256 NPA and shield the public from the consequences of premature area code splits or overlays due to inefficient utilization of existing resources. Similarly, the Idaho Commission requests this authority, in the 208 NPA, to protect the public from the unnecessary costs and confusion related to area code splits or overlays, particularly when numbering resources exist to prevent it.

Interested parties may file comments on the petitions on or before **June 15, 2007** and reply comments on or before **July 2, 2007**. All pleadings are to reference **CC Docket Nos. 99-200 and 96-98**. Comments may be filed using: (1) the Commission's Electronic Comment Filing System (ECFS), (2) the Federal Government's eRulemaking Portal, or (3) by filing paper copies.⁴
