The following application was filed pursuant to section 63.03 of the Commission's rules requesting authority to transfer control of the blanket domestic 214 authorizations held by Pine Telephone Systems, Inc. ("Pine Telephone"), its owners Rodney G. Huff, Colin Huff, and Eane Huff (the "Transferors"), and Pine Communications, LLC ("Pine Communications") (the "Transferee"), (Pine Telephone and Pine Communications, together, the "Applicants,"), which will result from Pine Communications' proposed acquisition of 100 percent of the stock of Pine Telephone.¹ Pine Telephone, an Oregon corporation, provides local exchange, exchange access and long distance telecommunications service in rural northeast Oregon. Pine Communications, a Texas limited liability company that does not provide telecommunications services, is owned by four U.S. citizens and a Texas partnership: John B. Hemphill, Ron L. Milford, R. Gray Mundell, William Ted Alexander, and Alexander Construction Company. The Applicants assert that the proposed transaction is entitled to presumptive streamlined treatment under section 63.03(b)(1)(ii) of the Commission's rules² and that a grant of the application will serve the public interest, convenience, and necessity.

GENERAL INFORMATION

The transfer of control identified herein has been found, upon initial review, to be acceptable for filing as a streamlined application. The Commission reserves the right to return any transfer of control application if, upon further examination, it is determined to be defective and not in conformance with the Commission's rules and policies. Pursuant to section 63.03(a) of the Commission's rules, 47 CFR § 63.03(a), interested parties may file **comments on or before June 15, 2007** and **reply comments on or before June 22, 2007**.³ Unless otherwise notified by the Commission, Applicants are permitted to transfer control on the 31st day after the date of this notice.⁴ Comments may be filed using: (1) the Commission's Electronic Comment Filing System (ECFS), (2) the Federal Government's eRulemaking Portal, or (3) by filing paper copies. *See Electronic Filing of Documents in Rulemaking Proceedings*, 63 FR 24121 (1998).
