## COMMENT SOUGHT ON A PETITION BY DOBSON CELLULAR SYSTEMS, INC. AND AMERICAN CELLULAR CORPORATION TO REDEFINE THE SERVICE AREAS OF CERTAIN RURAL INCUMBENT LOCAL EXCHANGE CARRIERS IN THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA

The Wireline Competition Bureau seeks comment on a petition filed by Dobson Cellular Systems, Inc. (Dobson) and American Cellular Corporation (ACC) pursuant to section 54.207 of the Commission's rules, requesting the Commission's agreement with the decision of the Oklahoma Corporation Commission (Oklahoma Commission) to redefine the service areas of certain rural telephone companies in Oklahoma at the wire center level.<sup>1</sup>

Section 54.207 of the Commission's rules, which implements section 214(e)(5) of the Communications Act of 1934, as amended, provides that a rural telephone company's service area will be its study area "unless and until the Commission and the states, after taking into account the recommendations of a Federal-State Joint Board instituted under section 410(c), establish a different definition of service area for such company."<sup>2</sup>

This is the Public Notice required by section 54.207(c)(2) of the Commission's rules.<sup>3</sup> If the Commission initiates a proceeding to consider the Petition, it must do so within 90 days of the release date of this Public Notice, pursuant to our rules.<sup>4</sup> If the Commission does not act on the Petition by **September 3, 2007**, the definition proposed by the Oklahoma Commission will be deemed approved by the Commission and shall take effect in accordance with state procedures.<sup>5</sup>

Interested parties may file comments on or before **July 5**, **2007**, and reply comments on or before **July 19**, **2007**. All pleadings are to reference **CC Docket No. 96-45**. Comments may be filed using the Commission's Electronic Comment Filing System (ECFS), or by filing paper copies.<sup>6</sup>

- Electronic Filers: Comments may be filed electronically using the Internet by accessing the ECFS: <u>http://www.fcc.gov/cgb/ecfs/</u>. Filers should follow the instructions provided on the website for submitting comments.
- For ECFS filers, if multiple docket or rulemaking numbers appear in the caption of this proceeding, filers must transmit one electronic copy of the comments for each docket or rulemaking number referenced in the caption. In completing the transmittal screen, filers should include their full name, U.S. Postal Service mailing address, and the applicable docket or rulemaking number. Parties may also submit an electronic comment by Internet e-mail. To get filing instructions, filers should send an e-mail to <a href="mailto.ecfs@fcc.gov">ecfs@fcc.gov</a>, and include the following words in the body of the message, "get form." A sample form and directions will be sent in response.
- Paper Filers: Parties who choose to file by paper must file an original and four copies of each filing. If more than one docket or rulemaking number appears in the caption of this proceeding, filers must submit two additional copies for each additional docket or rulemaking number.

Filings can be sent by hand or messenger delivery, by commercial overnight courier, or by firstclass or overnight U.S. Postal Service mail (although we continue to experience delays in receiving U.S. Postal Service mail). All filings must be addressed to the Commission's Secretary, Office of the Secretary, Federal Communications Commission.

The Commission's contractor will receive hand-delivered or messenger-delivered paper filings for the Commission's Secretary at 236 Massachusetts Avenue, N.E., Suite 110, Washington, D.C. 20002. The filing hours at this location are 8:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. All hand deliveries must be held together with rubber bands or fasteners. Any envelopes must be disposed of <u>before</u> entering the building. This matter shall be treated as a "permit-but-disclose" proceeding in accordance with the Commission's *ex parte* rules.<sup>7</sup> Persons making oral *ex parte* presentations are reminded that memoranda summarizing the presentations must contain summaries of the substance of the presentation and not merely a listing of the subjects discussed. More than a one or two sentence description of the views and arguments presented generally is required.<sup>8</sup> Other rules pertaining to oral and written *ex parte* presentations in permit-but-disclose proceedings are set forth in section 1.1206(b) of the Commission's rules.<sup>9</sup>
