WIRELINE COMPETITION BUREAU SEEKS COMMENT ON REQUEST FOR FURTHER WAIVER TO EXTEND RELIEF TO SCHOOLS AND LIBRARIES IN LOUISIANA AND MISSISSIPPI DIRECTLY AFFECTED BY HURRICANE KATRINA

The Commission's *Katrina Relief Order*, released October 14, 2005, provided targeted support to schools and libraries from the Universal Service Fund in the wake of the devastation caused by Hurricane Katrina.¹ Among other things, the Order allowed affected schools and libraries to (1) re-open the Funding Year 2005 filing window; (2) receive the highest level of priority for Priority Two services (*i.e.*, 90%) for Funding Years 2005 and 2006; (3) "restart the clock" for the purposes of calculating compliance with the "two-in-five" rule;² (4) substitute services or products in one broad category for another; and (5) serve displaced students and citizens by amending their Funding Year 2005 applications to account for the unexpected increase in population.³ Schools and libraries had to certify that the services and products sought in their applications would be solely used to restore the network to the functional equivalent of the pre-Hurricane Katrina degree of functionality (*i.e.*, prior to August 29, 2005).⁴

On August 1, 2007, the states of Louisiana and Mississippi (States) filed a request for further waiver to extend relief provided in the *Katrina Relief Order* under the schools and libraries universal service support mechanism (E-rate program) to directly affected schools and libraries in Louisiana and

Mississippi for Funding Year 2007.⁵ The States request that the Commission waive section 54.507 of its rules⁶ and treat all schools and libraries directly affected by Hurricane Katrina at the 90% discount level, the highest level of priority for Priority Two services under the E-rate program, for Funding Year 2007.⁷ The States additionally request that priority treatment not be limited solely to projects needed to restore schools and libraries to pre-Hurricane Katrina functionality.⁸

Interested parties may file comments on or before **August 30, 2007**, and reply comments on or before **September 13, 2007**. All pleadings are to reference **CC Docket No. 02-6**. Comments may be filed using the Commission's Electronic Comment Filing System (ECFS), or by filing paper copies.⁹

- Electronic Filers: Comments may be filed electronically using the Internet by accessing the ECFS: http://www.fcc.gov/cgb/ecfs/. Filers should follow the instructions provided on the website for submitting comments.

A sample form and directions will be sent in response.
