COMMENT SOUGHT ON TWO APPLICATIONS FOR REVIEW OF THE WIRELINE COMPETITION BUREAU'S ORDERS DENYING AMERICAN CYBER CORP., ET AL. AND AMERICAN TELECOMMUNICATIONS SYSTEMS, INC. REQUESTS FOR REVIEW OF UNIVERSAL SERVICE ADMINISTRATOR DECISIONS

On April 11, 2007, American Cyber Corp., Coleman Enterprises, Inc., Inmark, Inc. d/b/a Preferred Billing, Lotel, Inc. d/b/a Coordinated Billing, and Protel Advantage, Inc. (ACC *et al.*) jointly filed an application for review of the Wireline Competition Bureau's (Bureau) order released on March 12, 2007, denying their requests for review of the decisions of the Universal Service Administrative Company (USAC) concerning contribution obligations to the Universal Service Fund (USF). On April 12, 2007, American Telecommunications Systems, Inc. (ATS) also filed an application for review of the Bureau's order released on March 14, 2007, denying its request for review of the decision of USAC concerning its contribution obligations. ACC *et al.* and ATS both argue in their petitions that the contribution obligations of another carrier with which they are contractually related relieves them of their universal service obligations. ACC *et al.* requests that the Commission reconsider the Bureau's *March 12 Order* and direct USAC to withdraw the disputed billings. ATS requests that the Commission

reconsider the Bureau's *March 14 Order* and direct USAC to refund ATS' disputed contribution payments.⁵

The Commission seeks comment on the petitions of ACC *et al.*'s and ATS. Interested parties may file **comments on or before September 13, 2007** and **reply comments on or before September 28, 2007**. Comments may be filed using: (1) the Commission's Electronic Comment Filing System (ECFS), (2) the Federal Government's eRulemaking Portal, or (3) by filing paper copies. *See Electronic Filing of Documents in Rulemaking Proceedings*, 63 FR 24121 (1998).
