REQUEST FOR COMMENT ON BLACK TELEVISION NEWS CHANNEL, INC.'S REQUEST FOR TEMPORARY WAIVER OF BAN ON ADVERTISING FOR DBS PUBLIC INTEREST SET-ASIDE CHANNELS

Black Television News Channel, Inc. ("BTNC") has filed a request for a temporary waiver of a provision of the Commission's rule regarding DBS public interest obligations. BTNC requests that the Commission grant it a three year waiver of the requirement that programming carried on the DBS reserved channels be free of advertisements. We request comment on the issues raised by BTNC's petition.

Parties must file responses to the waiver request on or before **October 26, 2007** and reply comments must be filed on or before **November 13, 2007**. We are assigning this proceeding a Commission docket number, **MB Docket No. 07-213**, in order to facilitate filing public comments. **All filings must reference Docket Number MB Docket No. 07-213**. Comments may be filed using: (1) the Commission's Electronic Comment Filing System (ECFS), (2) the Federal Government's eRulemaking Portal, or (3) by filing paper copies. *See Electronic Filing of Documents in Rulemaking Proceedings*.²

Paper Filers: Parties who choose to file by paper must file an original and four copies of each filing.
If more than one docket or rulemaking number appears in the caption of this proceeding, filers must submit two additional copies for each additional docket or rulemaking number.

Filings can be sent by hand or messenger delivery, by commercial overnight courier, or by first-class or overnight U.S. Postal Service mail (although we continue to experience delays in receiving U.S. Postal Service mail). Pursuant to Section 1.1200(a) of the Commission's rules, 47 C.F.R. §1.1200(a), this proceeding will be governed by permit-but-disclose *ex parte* procedures that are applicable to nonrestricted proceedings under Section 1.1206 of the Commission's rules, 47 C.F.R. §1.1206.³

Permit-but-disclose *ex parte* procedures permit interested parties to make *ex parte* presentations to the Commissioners and Commission employees and require that these presentations be disclosed in the record of the relevant proceeding. Persons making a written *ex parte* presentation to the Commissioners or Commission employees must file the written presentation with the Commission Secretary no later than the next business day after the presentation. 4Persons making oral *ex parte* presentations must file a summary of the presentation no later than the next business day after the presentation. 47 C.F.R. §1.1206(b)(2). All *ex parte* filings must be clearly labeled as such and must reference Docket Number **MB Docket No. 07-213**. Parties making oral *ex parte* presentations are directed to the Commission's statement reemphasizing the public's responsibility in permit-but-disclose proceedings and are reminded that memoranda summarizing the presentation must contain the presentation's substance and not merely list the subjects discussed. More than a one to two sentence description of the views and arguments presented is generally required. *See* 47 C.F.R. §1.1206.
