DOMESTIC SECTION 214 APPLICATION FILED FOR THE ACQUISITION OF ASSETS OF SHELL ROCK TELEPHONE COMPANY FROM RURAL COMMUNICATIONS HOLDING CORPORATION TO SHELL ROCK COMMUNICATIONS, INC.

NON-STREAMLINED PLEADING CYCLE ESTABLISHED

On October 9, 2007, Rural Communications Holding Corporation (RCHC) and its wholly owned subsidiary, Shell Rock Telephone Company (SRTC, together with RCHC, Transferors), filed an application pursuant to sections 63.03 and 63.04 of the Commission's rules¹ requesting approval to transfer assets of SRTC to Shell Rock Communications, Inc. (SRCI or Transferee) (collectively, Applicants).

The Applicants do not seek streamlined treatment for this application under section 63.03(b) of the Commission's rules.² SRTC, an Iowa corporation, is an incumbent local exchange carrier (LEC) serving the Shell Rock exchange in Butler County in northeast Iowa. SRCI is a newly-formed Iowa corporation that is a wholly owned subsidiary of Butler-Bremer Mutual Telephone Company d/b/a Butler-Bremer Communications ("BBC"). BBC, also an Iowa corporation, is an incumbent LEC serving four northeastern Iowa exchanges: (1) Plainfield (Bremer, Butler, and Chickasaw Counties); (2) Frederika (Bremer County); (3) Tripoli (Bremer County); and (4) Clarksville (Butler County). The Shell Rock exchange is adjacent to the Plainfield and Clarksville exchanges of BBC. Applicants state that RCHC's incumbent LEC subsidiaries, identified below, and BBC (and SRCI after it acquires the Shell Rock exchange) have, in combination, fewer than two percent of the nation's subscriber lines installed in the aggregate nationwide. However, because of the adjacent service areas the Applicants have identified, this application is not entitled to presumptive streamlined treatment.

In addition to SRTC, RCHC owns 100 percent of the following three rural incumbent LECs: Blue Earth Valley Telephone Company ("Blue Earth"), a Minnesota corporation that serves the Blue

Earth, Elmore, Guckeen, Huntley, Wells, and Winnebago exchanges in south central Minnesota; Easton Telephone Company ("Easton"), a Minnesota corporation that serves the Easton exchange in south central Minnesota; and Eckles Telephone Company ("Eckles"), a Minnesota corporation that serves the New Prague exchange in eastern Minnesota. In addition, Blue Earth Valley Telephone Company owns 100 percent of Minnesota Lake Telephone Company ("Minnesota Lake"), a Minnesota corporation that serves the Minnesota Lake exchange in south central Minnesota. Blue Earth Valley Communications, Inc. ("BEVCI"), a Minnesota corporation, owns 100 percent of the equity of RCHC. The following U.S. citizens and U.S.-based entities own at least 10 percent of the equity of BEVCI: Neil and Sue Eckles (22.41 percent); Gail Eckles (24.66 percent); William V. Eckles (19.84 percent); Eckles Dynasty Trust #1 (16.55 percent); and Eckles Dynasty Trust #2 (16.55 percent). Applicants state that no other individual or entity will directly or indirectly own at least 10 percent of the equity of SRTC or RCHC after the proposed transaction. BEVCI holds a 33 percent ownership interest in Hector Communications Corporation ("Hector"), a holding company that owns nine incumbent LECs that provide local exchange and resold long distance services in 28 rural exchanges in Minnesota, Wisconsin, and North Dakota.³

BBC, which Applicants state is the only entity that will own at least 10 percent of the equity of SRCI, has no interest holders that hold a 10 percent or greater interest in the company. In addition to its incumbent LEC exchanges identified above, BBC's wholly owned subsidiary, B&B Communications Network, Inc., an Iowa corporation, provides interstate and intrastate long distance toll services in and around Plainfield, Clarksville, Frederika, and Tripoli, Iowa. BBC's wholly owned subsidiary, Cedar-Wapsie Communications, Inc., also an Iowa corporation, provides wireless services in Butler, Bremer, and Chickasaw counties in Iowa.

The proposed transaction will be accomplished by the sale of SRTC's local exchange service business and assets to SRCI. The assets include SRTC's customer accounts, local exchange plant, real property, and federal and state authorizations. Applicants state that SRTC will remain in existence as an Iowa corporation and wholly owned subsidiary of RCHC, but will no longer provide local exchange service in the Shell Rock exchange.

Applicants state that the proposed transaction is in the public interest because RCHC's incumbent LEC subsidiaries and BBC are established rural telecommunications service providers and have proven records of providing high quality service at affordable rates, and that they will ensure that the residents of Shell Rock continue to receive these benefits.

GENERAL INFORMATION

The transfer of assets identified herein has been found, upon initial review, to be acceptable for filing as a non-streamlined application. The Commission reserves the right to return any transfer application if, upon further examination, it is determined to be defective and not in conformance with the Commission's rules and policies. Pursuant to section 63.03(a) of the Commission's rules, 47 CFR § 63.03(a), interested parties may file comments **on or before October 31, 2007** and reply comments **on or before November 7, 2007**. Comments may be filed using: (1) the Commission's Electronic Comment Filing System (ECFS), (2) the Federal Government's eRulemaking Portal, or (3) by filing paper copies. *See Electronic Filing of Documents in Rulemaking Proceedings*, 63 FR 24121 (1998).
