On October 2, 2007, Osirus Communications, Inc. (Osirus) filed a petition for waiver to become a member of the National Exchange Carrier Association (NECA), to participate in NECA tariffs and pools, and to begin receiving high-cost universal service support in a timely manner. Osirus seeks to provide local exchange service in eight unserved areas located in the Michigan counties of Alcona, Cheboygan, Gladwin, Montmorency, Oscoda, Ogemaw, and Presque Isle.²

Interested parties may file comments on or before January 3, 2008 and reply comments on or before January 18, 2008. Comments may be filed using the Commission's Electronic Comment Filing System (ECFS) or by filing paper copies.³

- Electronic Filers: Comments may be filed electronically using the Internet by accessing the ECFS: http://www.fcc.gov/cgb/ecfs/. Filers should follow the instructions provided on the website for submitting comments.
