COMMENT SOUGHT ON U.S. CELLULAR REQUEST TO AMEND ETC DESIGNATION IN TENNESSEE

On August 6, 2008, United States Cellular Corporation (U.S. Cellular) filed a request to amend its eligible telecommunications carrier (ETC) designation in the state of Tennessee. U.S. Cellular asks the Commission to amend its decision to deny U.S. Cellular's request for ETC designation in the rural study areas of Citizens Communications Company Tennessee d/b/a Frontier Communications of Tennessee, LLC (Citizens/Frontier) and Twin Lakes Cooperative Corporation (Twin Lakes). To alleviate the Commission's concerns about creamskimming in these study areas, U.S. Cellular proposes to delete the Cookeville wire center in the Citizens/Frontier study area and the Cookeville South wire center in Twin Lakes study area from its requested ETC designation area. U.S. Cellular also states that it is no longer seeking ETC designation in the study area of Tennessee Telephone Company.

Interested parties may file **comments on or before September 11, 2008** and **reply comments on or before September 26, 2008**. All pleadings are to reference **CC Docket No. 96-45**. Comments may be filed using the Commission's Electronic Comment Filing System (ECFS) or by filing paper copies.⁵
