On August 25, 2008, Columbia Ventures Corporation (CVC), FiberLink LLC d/b/a Columbia Fiber Solutions (CFS), and Zayo Group, LLC (Zayo) (collectively, Applicants) filed an application pursuant to section 63.03 of the Commission's rules requesting approval for the transfer of control of CFS to Zayo. CFS, a Washington limited liability company, is wholly owned by CVC, a Washington corporation wholly owned by Kenneth D. Peterson, Jr., a U.S. citizen CFS provides competitive fiber-optic network services in eastern Washington and northern Idaho. Zayo, a Delaware corporation, is wholly owned by Communications Infrastructure Investments, LLC, also a Delaware limited liability company. The following U.S.-based entities hold, directly or indirectly, a ten percent or greater interest in CII: Oak Investment Partners XII, Limited Partnership; Oak Associates XII, LLC<sup>3</sup>; M/C Venture Partners VI, L.P.; M/C VP VI, LP; M/C Venture Partners, LLC<sup>4</sup>; Columbia Capital Equity Partners IV (QP), L.P.; Columbia Capital IV, LLC<sup>5</sup>; Battery Ventures VII, LP; and Battery Partners VII, LLC.

Applicants state that the M/C Venture entities have interests in other telecommunications carriers that provide competitive telecommunications services in multiple states.<sup>7</sup> Pursuant to the terms of the proposed transaction, Zayo will acquire from CVC all of its membership interests in CFS. Applicants assert that the proposed transaction is entitled to presumptive streamlined treatment under section 63.03(b)(2)(i) of the Commission's rules and that a grant of the application will serve the public interest, convenience, and necessity.8
