## COMMENT SOUGHT ON CENTENNIAL COMMUNICATIONS CORP. REQUEST FOR REVIEW OF A HIGH-COST SUPPORT DECISION OF THE UNIVERSAL SERVICE ADMINISTRATIVE COMPANY

## PLEADING CYCLE ESTABLISHED

On September 8, 2008, Centennial Communications Corp. (Centennial) filed a request for review of a decision of the Universal Service Administrative Company (USAC). Specifically, Centennial seeks reversal of USAC's decision to retroactively recover from Centennial \$1,630,797 in Interstate Common Line Support associated with service in Puerto Rico for 2004 and 2005. Centennial contends, among other things, that USAC's decision was in error because it was based on late-filed data and untimely true-ups submitted by the incumbent local exchange carrier, Puerto Rico Telephone Company (PRTC). In the alternative, should the Commission find that USAC's retroactive adjustment is permissible, Centennial seeks a waiver of the Commission's identical support rule so that support is not based on PRTC's late filed data.

Interested parties may file **comments on or before October 23, 2008** and **reply comments on or before November 7, 2008**. Comments may be filed using the Commission's Electronic Comment Filing System (ECFS) or by filing paper copies.<sup>5</sup>
