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## COMMENT SOUGHT ON A PETITION FILED BY CENTENNIAL U.S.V.I. OPERATIONS CORP. FOR WAIVER OF SECTION 54.314(d)(1) OF THE COMMISSION'S RULES

The Wireline Competition Bureau seeks comment on a petition filed by Centennial U.S.V.I. Operations Corp. (Centennial) seeking an expedited waiver of the July 1, 2006, filing deadline set forth in section 54.314(d)(1) of the Commission's rules.<sup>1</sup> On February 22, 2008, the United States Virgin Islands Public Service Commission (VIPSC) designated Centennial as an eligible telecommunications carrier (ETC) in the United States Virgin Islands (USVI), effective "December 2, 2006, the date on which Centennial submitted its petition to the VIPSC."<sup>2</sup> Centennial claims "a waiver of the July 1, 2006 filing deadline will allow Centennial to receive universal service support beginning as of the effective date of its ETC designation for the USVI."<sup>3</sup>

Interested parties may file **comments on or before April 28, 2008** and **reply comments on or before May 13, 2008**. All pleadings are to reference **CC Docket No. 96-45**. Comments may be filed using the Commission's Electronic Comment Filing System (ECFS) or by filing paper copies.<sup>4</sup>

- **Electronic Filers:** Comments may be filed electronically using the Internet by accessing the ECFS: <http://www.fcc.gov/cgb/ecfs/>. Filers should follow the instructions provided on the website for submitting comments.
- **For ECFS filers,** if multiple docket or rulemaking numbers appear in the caption of this proceeding, filers must transmit one electronic copy of the comments for each docket or rulemaking number referenced in the caption. In completing the transmittal screen, filers should include their full name, U.S. Postal Service mailing address, and the applicable docket or rulemaking number. Parties may also submit an electronic comment by Internet e-mail. More than a one or two sentence description of the views and arguments presented generally is required.<sup>6</sup> Other rules pertaining to oral and written *ex parte* presentations in permit-but-disclose proceedings are set forth in section 1.1206(b) of the Commission's rules.<sup>7</sup>
