COMMENT SOUGHT ON SEND TECHNOLOGIES, L.L.C./NEXUS SYSTEMS, INC. PETITION FOR PARTIAL RECONSIDERATION OF THE WIRELINE COMPETITION BUREAU'S CALDWELL PARISH ORDER DENYING JACKSON PARISH SCHOOL DISTRICT'S REQUEST FOR REVIEW OF A DECISION OF THE UNIVERSAL SERVICE ADMINISTRATIVE COMPANY

On March 24, 2008, SEND Technologies, L.L.C./Nexus Systems, Inc. (SEND) filed a petition for partial reconsideration of the Wireline Competition Bureau's (Bureau) *Caldwell Parish Order*, which, among other things, denied Jackson Parish School District's (Jackson) Request for Review of a decision by the Universal Service Administrative Company (USAC) denying it discounted services for Funding Years 2003 and 2004 under the schools and libraries universal service support mechanism, also known as the E-rate program.¹ Specifically, SEND requests the Bureau to conduct a complete review of the record for Funding Years 2003 and 2004 to determine whether Jackson complied with the Commission's competitive bidding requirements in 2003 and 2004.² SEND asserts that the competitive process for Funding Year 2002 did not violate the Commission's competitive bidding requirements.³ SEND thus requests the Bureau to remand Jackson's underlying applications for Funding Years 2003 and 2004 to USAC for a complete review of the competitive bidding processes that were undertaken for those funding years.⁴

The Bureau seeks comment on SEND's petition. Interested parties may file **comments on or before May 14, 2008** and **reply comments on or before May 29, 2008**. Comments may be filed using the Commission's Electronic Comment Filing System (ECFS) or by filing paper copies.⁵
