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THE COMMISSION WELCOMES RESPONSES TO STAFF WORKSHOPS

GN Docket No. 09-51

As the Commission prepares for the development of a National Broadband Plan,¹ Commission staff have hosted and continue to host a series of [broadband workshops](#) in order to better understand the broadband marketplace as well as the social implications and potential of broadband.² The conversation and debate are an important part of the record upon which the Commission will build its plan. We encourage anyone interested to respond to the facts and reasoning asserted during these workshops, or to raise facts and reasoning that should have been discussed.³

Deadlines: Responses to workshops held from August 6 to August 20 should be filed with the Commission by **September 15**.⁴

Responses to workshops held from August 25 to September 15 should be filed with the Commission by **October 2**.⁵

Responses to workshops held from September 16 to October 20 should be filed with the Commission by **October 30**.⁶

We encourage those interested to [file online](#) using the Commission's electronic comment filing system (ECFS).⁷ Sending your response in this way is a 2-step process.

1. The first step is to complete the cover sheet with information as required.
 - a. Please enter the proceeding number(s) applicable (e.g., 09-51)
 - b. Responses to the workshops should be filed as "ex parte" notices. When completing box number 12 on the cover sheet, please select "Notice of Ex Parte" from the drop menu.
2. The second step is to choose one of the two transmittal methods: sending a file that you attach, or sending a short message that you type directly on the page.

All filings should refer to GN Docket No. 09-51. Please title filings responsive to this Notice as "Workshop Response" or "Workshop Response – [title of workshop]" (for example, Workshop Response – Education). Interested parties may file responses to workshops held through August 20 on or before **September 15, 2009**, and responses to workshops held through September 15 on or before **October 2, 2009** and responses to workshops held through October 20 on or before October 30, 2009. All pleadings are to reference GN Docket No. 09-51. Submissions may be filed using: (1) the Commission's Electronic Comment Filing System (ECFS), (2) the Federal Government's e-Rulemaking Portal, or (3) by filing paper copies.⁸

- Electronic Filers: Comments may be filed electronically using the Internet by accessing the ECFS: <http://www.fcc.gov/cgb/ecfs/> or the Federal e-Rulemaking Portal: <http://www.regulations.gov>. Filers should follow the instructions provided on the Web site for submitting comments.
- For ECFS filers, if multiple docket or rulemaking numbers appear in the caption of this proceeding, filers must transmit one electronic copy of the comments for each docket or rulemaking number referenced in the caption. In completing the transmittal screen, filers should include their full name, U.S. Postal Service mailing address, and the applicable docket or rulemaking number. Parties may also submit an electronic comment by Internet e-mail. To get filing instructions, filers should send an e-mail to ecfs@fcc.gov, and include the following words in the body of the message, "get form." A sample form and directions will be sent in response.
- Paper Filers: Parties who choose to file by paper must file an original and four copies of each filing. If more than one docket or rulemaking number appears in the caption of this proceeding, filers must submit two additional copies for each additional docket or rulemaking number.

Filings can be sent by hand or messenger delivery, by commercial overnight courier, or by first-class or overnight U.S. Postal Service mail (although we continue to experience delays in receiving U.S. Postal Service mail). All filings must be addressed to the Commission's Secretary, Office of the Secretary, Federal Communications Commission.

- The Commission's contractor will receive hand-delivered or messenger-delivered paper filings for the Commission's Secretary at 236 Massachusetts Avenue, NE, Suite 110, Washington, D.C. 20002. The filing hours at this location are 8:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. All hand deliveries must be held together with rubber bands or fasteners. Any envelopes must be disposed of before entering the building.

This matter shall be treated as a "permit-but-disclose" proceeding in accordance with the Commission's *ex parte* rules.⁹ Persons making oral *ex parte* presentations are reminded that memoranda summarizing the presentations must contain summaries of the substance of the presentations and not merely a listing of the subjects discussed. More than a one- or two-sentence description of the views and arguments presented generally is required.¹⁰ Other rules pertaining to oral and written *ex parte* presentations in permit-but-disclose proceedings are set forth in section 1.1206(b) of the Commission's rules.¹¹
