## STREAMLINED PLEADING CYCLE ESTABLISHED

On October 28, 2009, NobelTel, LLC (NobelTel or Applicant) filed an application pursuant to section 63.03 of the Commission's rules¹ seeking approval to transfer control of NobelTel from its current owners to Mr. Richard Mahfouz. NobelTel, a Delaware limited liability company, is a wholly owned subsidiary of Nobel, Inc., a privately held Delaware corporation owned by Mr. Thomas Knobel (96 percent) and Mr. Michael Knobel (4 percent), both U.S. citizens. NobelTel provides resold interstate and intrastate interexchange service in all states and the District of Columbia, except Alaska. Mr. Richard Mahfouz is a U.S. citizen. Applicants state that, after the proposed transaction, NobelTel will not have any affiliates that offer domestic telecommunications services. Pursuant to the terms of the proposed transaction, Nobel Holding, Inc., a Delaware corporation and newly formed holding company owned by Mr. Mahfouz, will purchase 100 percent of the shares of Nobel, Inc. Applicant asserts that the proposed transaction is entitled to presumptive streamlined treatment under section 63.03(b)(2)(i) of the Commission's rules and that a grant of the application will serve the public interest, convenience, and necessity.²

Commission's rules, 47 CFR § 63.03(a), interested parties may file comments **on or before November 16, 2009**, and reply comments **on or before November 23, 2009**. Unless otherwise notified by the Commission, the Applicants may transfer control on the 31<sup>st</sup> day after the date of this notice.<sup>3</sup> Comments must be filed electronically using (1) the Commission's Electronic Comment Filing System (ECFS) or (2) the Federal Government's e-Rulemaking Portal. *See* 47 C.F.R. § 63.03(a) ("All comments on streamlined applications shall be filed electronically . . . ."); *Electronic Filing of Documents in Rulemaking Proceedings*, 63 FR 24121 (1998).
