COMMENT SOUGHT ON THE JOINT PETITION OF IOWA TELECOMMUNICATIONS SERVICES, INC. AND WELLMAN COOPERATIVE TELEPHONE ASSOCIATION TO WAIVE THE STUDY AREA BOUNDARY FREEZE AS CODIFIED IN PART 36 OF THE COMMISSION'S RULES AND SECTIONS 54.305 AND 69.605(c) OF THE COMMISSION'S RULES

On October 16, 2009, Iowa Telecommunications Services, Inc. (Iowa Telecom) and Wellman Cooperative Telephone Association (Wellman) filed a joint petition for waiver of the study area boundary freeze.¹ Iowa Telecom and Wellman seek a waiver of the study area boundary freeze to transfer a small area from Iowa Telecom's existing Iowa study area to Wellman's existing Iowa study area.² Wellman also requests a waiver of section 54.305 of the Commission's rules so that it may receive universal service support for the acquired line in the same manner as its existing lines, and Wellman seeks a waiver of the average schedule company definition so that it may continue to operate as an average schedule company after the transfer.³

Interested parties may file **comments on or before January 21, 2010**, and **reply comments on or before February 5, 2010**. All pleadings are to reference **CC Docket No. 96-45**. Comments may be filed using the Commission's Electronic Comment Filing System (ECFS), or by filing paper copies.⁴

summarizing the presentations must contain summaries of the substance of the presentation and not merely a listing of the subjects discussed. More than a one or two sentence description of the views and arguments presented generally is required.⁶ Other rules pertaining to oral and written *ex parte* presentations in permit-but-disclose proceedings are set forth in section 1.1206(b) of the Commission's rules.⁷
