WIRELINER COMPETITION BUREAU SEEKS COMMENT ON NEUSTAR AMENDED REQUEST FOR FCC'S APPROVAL TO INCREASE NEUSTAR'S PRE-APPROVED LIMIT FOR CERTAIN DEBT TRANSACTIONS

PLEADING CYCLE ESTABLISHED

This Notice seeks comment on Neustar, Inc.'s amended request¹ for the Federal Communications Commission's (Commission's) approval to increase Neustar's pre-approved limit for certain debt transactions established by the Wireline Competition Bureau (WCB) in January 2007.²

Specifically, Neustar asks that the Commission increase Neustar's pre-approved limit for certain debt transactions from one billion dollars to three billion dollars.³ Neustar does not seek to change any other condition set forth in the WCB 2007 Letter.⁴

Interested parties may file comments on Neustar's request on or before **October 22, 2010**. All pleadings are to reference CC Docket No. 92-237. Comments may be filed using: (1) the Commission's Electronic Comment Filing System (ECFS), (2) the Federal Government's eRulemaking Portal, or (3) by filing paper copies.⁵

- Electronic Filers: Comments may be filed electronically using the Internet by accessing the ECFS: <http://www.fcc.gov/cgb/ecfs/> or the Federal eRulemaking Portal: <http://www.regulations.gov>. Filers should follow the instructions provided on the website for submitting comments.
- For ECFS filers, if multiple docket or rulemaking numbers appear in the caption of this proceeding, filers must transmit one electronic copy of the comments for each docket or rulemaking number referenced in the caption. In completing the transmittal screen, filers should include their full name, U.S. Postal Service mailing address, and the applicable docket or rulemaking number. Parties may also submit an electronic comment by Internet e-mail. To get filing instructions, filers should send an e-mail to ecfs@fcc.gov, and include the following words in the body of the message, “get form.” A sample form and directions will be sent in response.

This matter shall be treated as a “permit-but-disclose” proceeding in accordance with the Commission’s *ex parte* rules.⁶ Persons making oral *ex parte* presentations are reminded that memoranda

summarizing the presentations must contain summaries of the substance of the presentations and not merely a listing of the subjects discussed. More than a one- or two-sentence description of the views and arguments presented generally is required.⁷ Other rules pertaining to oral and written *ex parte* presentations in permit-but-disclose proceedings are set forth in section 1.1206(b) of the Commission's rules.⁸
