COMMENT SOUGHT ON A PETITION BY STANDING ROCK TELECOMMUNICATIONS, INC. TO REDEFINE CERTAIN RURAL SERVICE AREAS IN NORTH AND SOUTH DAKOTA

The Wireline Competition Bureau provides notice that it is initiating a proceeding to consider a petition filed by Standing Rock Telecommunications, Inc. (Standing Rock), pursuant to section 54.207 of the Commission's rules, to redefine the service area served by several rural telephone companies in North and South Dakota.¹

The Commission's rules allow the Commission to initiate a proceeding to consider a definition of a service area served by a rural telephone company that is different from that company's study area.² If the Commission proposes to redefine such an area, it must seek agreement of the state commission and the "proposed definition shall not take effect until both the state commission and the Commission agree upon the definition of a rural service area."³

Interested parties may file **comments on or before March 26, 2010**, and **reply comments on or before April 12, 2010**. All pleadings are to reference **WC Docket No. 09-197**. Comments may be filed using the Commission's Electronic Comment Filing System (ECFS) or by filing paper copies.⁴

This matter shall be treated as a "permit-but-disclose" proceeding in accordance with the Commission's *ex parte* rules.⁵ Persons making oral *ex parte* presentations are reminded that memoranda summarizing the presentations must contain summaries of the substance of the presentation and not merely a listing of the subjects discussed. More than a one or two sentence description of the views and arguments presented generally is required.⁶ Other rules pertaining to oral and written *ex parte* presentations in permit-but-disclose proceedings are set forth in section 1.1206(b) of the Commission's rules.⁷
