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## WIRELINE COMPETITION BUREAU SEEKS COMMENT ON REQUESTS FOR REVIEW BY AT&T INC., T-MOBILE USA, INC., AND TRACFONE WIRELESS, INC. OF DECISIONS OF THE UNIVERSAL SERVICE ADMINISTRATOR CONCERNING AUDIT FINDINGS RELATING TO THE LOW-INCOME PROGRAM

## WC DOCKET NO. 03-109

Pending before the Wireline Competition Bureau (Bureau) are three requests for review of certain Universal Service Administrative Company (USAC) low-income support audit findings against Cingular Wireless (Cingular),<sup>1</sup> T-Mobile USA, Inc. (T-Mobile), and TracFone Wireless, Inc. (TracFone).<sup>2</sup> In each case, USAC found that the carrier failed to comply with the documentation retention requirements of the Commission's *Hurricane Katrina Order*.<sup>3</sup>

In its request for review, AT&T challenges USAC's finding that, because Cingular could not produce documentation to substantiate the eligibility of its Katrina Lifeline subscribers, USAC should recover the full amount of Katrina Lifeline support disbursed to Cingular.<sup>4</sup> Similarly, T-Mobile seeks review of USAC's findings that T-Mobile (1) failed to produce documentation to substantiate the eligibility of its Katrina Lifeline subscribers, and (2) provided Lifeline services to ineligible subscribers with "business-like" names.<sup>5</sup> Finally, TracFone challenges USAC's findings that TracFone (1) failed to

ensure that the documentation provided by its Katrina Lifeline subscribers demonstrated their eligibility for FEMA disaster housing assistance, and (2) did not produce documentation to substantiate the eligibility of its Katrina Lifeline subscribers.<sup>6</sup>

Interested parties may file **comments on or before April 30, 2010**, and **reply comments on or before May 17, 2010**. All pleadings are to reference **WC Docket No. 03-109**. Comments may be filed using the Commission's Electronic Comment Filing System (ECFS), or by filing paper copies.<sup>7</sup>

- Electronic Filers: Comments may be filed electronically using the Internet by accessing the ECFS: http://www.fcc.gov/cgb/ecfs/.
- Paper Filers: Parties who choose to file by paper must file an original and four copies of each filing. If more than one docket or rulemaking number appears in the caption of this proceeding, filers must submit two additional copies for each additional docket or rulemaking number.
