COMMENT SOUGHT ON THE PUERTO RICO TELEPHONE COMPANY, INC. PETITION FOR RECONSIDERATION OF THE COMMISSION'S UNIVERSAL SERVICE HIGH-COST INSULAR SUPPORT ORDER

The Wireline Competition Bureau seeks comment on a petition filed by Puerto Rico Telephone Company, Inc. (PRTC)¹ requesting that the Commission reconsider its decision declining to establish a new universal service high-cost support mechanism for non-rural insular carriers.² The Commission concluded that dramatic increases in telephone subscribership in Puerto Rico over the last several years made it unnecessary to adopt a new high-cost support mechanism for non-rural insular carriers as proposed by PRTC.

Pursuant to section 1.429(e) of the Commission's rules, interested parties may file **comments 15** days after the date of publication of this public notice in the Federal Register and reply comments 25 days after the date of publication of this public notice in the Federal Register.³ All pleadings are to reference WC Docket No. 05-337. Comments may be filed using the Commission's Electronic Comment Filing System (ECFS), or by filing paper copies.⁴

This matter shall be treated as a "permit-but-disclose" proceeding in accordance with the Commission's *ex parte* rules.⁵ Persons making oral *ex parte* presentations are reminded that memoranda summarizing the presentations must contain summaries of the substance of the presentation and not merely a listing of the subjects discussed. More than a one or two sentence description of the views and arguments presented generally is required.⁶ Other rules pertaining to oral and written *ex parte* presentations in permit-but-disclose proceedings are set forth in section 1.1206(b) of the Commission's rules.⁷
