NEW CINGULAR WIRELESS PCS, LLC AND D&E INVESTMENTS, INC. SEEK FCC CONSENT TO THE ASSIGNMENT OF LOWER 700 MHZ BAND LICENSES

I. INTRODUCTION

New Cingular Wireless PCS, LLC ("New Cingular") and D&E Investments, Inc. ("D&E") (collectively, "the Applicants") have filed an application pursuant to Section 310(d) of the Communications Act of 1934, as amended, seeking to assign six lower 700 MHz band licenses from D&E to New Cingular. New Cingular is an indirect, wholly-owned subsidiary of AT&T Inc. ("AT&T"), and D&E is a wholly-owned subsidiary of Windstream Corporation. The Applicants state that the additional spectrum will enable AT&T to increase its system capacity to enhance existing services, better accommodate its overall growth, and facilitate the provision of additional products and services to the public in the Lancaster, PA, Reading, PA, Altoona, PA, Williamsport, PA, State College, PA, and Pennsylvania 12-Lebanon CMAs.

Preliminary review of the application indicates that in three of the CMAs – Lancaster, PA, Reading, PA, and Williamsport, PA – AT&T would hold, post-transaction, 49 megahertz of spectrum below 1 GHz. In addition, in those same three CMAs, post-transaction, only AT&T and Verizon Wireless would hold paired spectrum below 1 GHz (excluding lower 700 MHz D block and SMR spectrum).

The application for consent to the full assignment of the six lower 700 MHz band licenses from D&E or New Cingular has been assigned the following file number:

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III. EX PARTE STATUS OF THIS PROCEEDING

Pursuant to Section 1.1200(a) of the Commission's rules,² the Commission may adopt modified or more stringent *ex parte* procedures in particular proceedings if the public interest so requires. We announce that this proceeding will be governed by permit-but-disclose *ex parte* procedures that are applicable to non-restricted proceedings under Section 1.1206 of the Commission's rules.³

Parties making oral *ex parte* presentations are directed to the Commission's statement reemphasizing the public's responsibility in permit-but-disclose proceedings and are reminded that memoranda summarizing the presentation must contain the presentation's substance and not merely list the subjects discussed.⁴ More than a one- or two-sentence description of the views and arguments presented is generally required.⁵ Other rules pertaining to oral and written presentations are set forth in Section 1.1206(b) as well.⁶

IV. GENERAL INFORMATION

The assignment application referenced herein has been found, upon initial review, to be acceptable for filing. The Commission reserves the right to return any application if, upon further examination, it is determined to be defective and not in conformance with the Commission's rules or policies.

Interested parties must file petitions to deny no later than January 19, 2011. Persons and entities that file petitions to deny become parties to the proceeding. They may participate fully in the proceeding, including seeking access to any confidential information that may be filed under a protective order, seeking reconsideration of decisions, and filing appeals of a final decision to the courts. Oppositions to such pleadings must be filed no later than January 31, 2011. Replies to such pleadings must be filed no later than February 7, 2011. All filings concerning matters referenced in this Public Notice should refer to ULS File No. 0004448347.

Under the Commission's current procedures for the submission of filings and other documents,⁷ submissions in this matter may be filed electronically (*i.e.*, though the Commission's Universal Licensing System ("ULS")) or by hand delivery to the Commission.
