By the Deputy Chief, Telecommunications Access Policy Division, Wireline Competition Bureau:

1. Consistent with the Commission's decision in the *Alpaugh Unified School District Order*,¹ we grant five appeals of decisions by the Universal Service Administrative Company (USAC) that reduce or deny funding from the E-rate program for various funding years because USAC found that

the applicants failed to respond to USAC's requests for additional information within the USAC-specified time frame.² In *Alpaugh Unified School District Order*, the Commission granted 78 appeals of applicants denied funding because they failed to respond to USAC's request for information within the USAC-specified time frame.³ The Commission found that a complete rejection of the applications was not warranted, given that the applicants missed a USAC procedural deadline and did not violate a Commission rule.⁴ Based on our review of the record, we find that the same analysis applies, and we remand the underlying applications to USAC to allow the applicants another opportunity to respond to USAC's requests for further information. To ensure that the underlying applications are resolved expeditiously, we direct USAC to complete its review of each application listed in the appendix and issue an award or a denial based on a complete review and analysis no later than 90 calendar days from its receipt of the requested information.⁵

2. We also grant three petitioners waivers of our filing deadline for appeals⁶ because we find that they submitted their appeals to the Commission within a reasonable period of time after receiving actual notice of USAC's adverse decisions.⁷

3. ACCORDINGLY, IT IS ORDERED, pursuant to the authority contained in sections 1-4 and 254 of the Communications Act of 1934, as amended, 47 U.S.C. §§ 151-154 and 254, and pursuant to authority delegated in sections 0.91, 0.291, 1.3, and 54.722(a) of the Commission's rules, 47 C.F.R. §§ 0.91, 0.291, 1.3, and 54.722(a), that the Requests for Review and/or Requests for Waiver filed by Burlington Township School District, Holy Name of Jesus, Lakewood Cheder School, The Center for Life Enrichment, and The Potomac School ARE GRANTED and their underlying applications ARE REMANDED to USAC for further consideration in accordance with the terms of this order.

4. IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that, pursuant to the authority contained in sections 1-4 and 254 of the Communications Act of 1934, as amended, 47 U.S.C. §§ 151-154 and 254, and sections 0.91, 0.291, and 1.3 of the Commission's rules, 47 C.F.R. §§ 0.91, 0.291, and 1.3 of the Commission's rules, that section 54.720(a) of the Commission's rules, 47 C.F.R. § 54.720(a), ARE WAIVED for Burlington Township School District, Holy Name of Jesus School, The Center for Life Enrichment, and The Potomac School to the extent necessary as provided herein.

5. IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, pursuant to the authority contained in sections 1-4 and 254 of the Communications Act of 1934, as amended, 47 U.S.C. §§ 151-154 and 254, and pursuant to authority delegated in sections 0.91 and 0.291 of the Commission's rules, 47 C.F.R. §§ 0.91 and 0.291, that USAC SHALL COMPLETE its review of each remanded applications and ISSUE an award or denial based on a complete review and analysis no later than 90 calendar days from the release date of this order.
