USCOC OF GREATER IOWA, LLC AND LL LICENSE HOLDINGS, LLC SEEK FCC CONSENT TO THE ASSIGNMENT OF LOWER 700 MHZ BAND A BLOCK LICENSE

I. INTRODUCTION

USCOC of Greater Iowa, LLC (“USCOC-GI”), an indirect wholly-owned subsidiary of United States Cellular Corporation (collectively, “USCC”), and LL License Holdings, LLC (“Long Lines”) (collectively, “the Applicants”) have filed an application pursuant to Section 310(d) of the Communications Act of 1934, as amended,¹ seeking to assign one Lower 700 MHz A Block license from Long Lines to USCOC-GI. The Applicants state that the additional spectrum will enable USCC to offer innovative services in BEA 117-Sioux City, IA-NE-SD and to improve and enhance its voice and data service offerings.

Preliminary review of the application indicates that in two of the six Cellular Market Areas (“CMAs”) implicated by the subject application, USCOC-GI would hold, post transaction, up to 49 megahertz of spectrum below 1 GHz.

II. SECTION 310(d) APPLICATION

The following application for consent to the full assignment of a Lower 700 MHz A Block license from Long Lines to USCOC-GI has been assigned the following file number:

III. *EX PARTE* STATUS OF THIS PROCEEDING

Pursuant to Section 1.1200(a) of the Commission's rules,² the Commission may adopt modified or more stringent *ex parte* procedures in particular proceedings if the public interest so requires.³ We announce that this proceeding will be governed by permit-but-disclose *ex parte* procedures that are applicable to non-restricted proceedings under Section 1.1206 of the Commission's rules.⁴

Parties making oral *ex parte* presentations are directed to the Commission's revised *ex parte* rules. Parties are reminded that memoranda summarizing the presentation must contain the presentation's substance and not merely list the subjects discussed.⁵ More than a one- or two-sentence description of the views and arguments presented is generally required.⁶ Other rules pertaining to oral and written presentations are set forth in Section 1.1206(b) as well.⁷

IV. GENERAL INFORMATION

The assignment application referenced herein has been found, upon initial review, to be acceptable for filing. The Commission reserves the right to return any application if, upon further examination, it is determined to be defective and not in conformance with the Commission's rules or policies.

Interested parties must file petitions to deny no later than **August 19, 2011**. Persons and entities that file petitions to deny become parties to the proceeding. They may participate fully in the proceeding, including seeking access to any confidential information that may be filed under a protective order, seeking reconsideration of decisions, and filing appeals of a final decision to the courts. Oppositions to such pleadings must be filed no later than **August 29, 2011**. Replies to such pleadings must be filed no later than **September 6, 2011**. All filings concerning matters referenced in this Public Notice should refer to ULS File No. 0004742997.

Under the Commission's current procedures for the submission of filings and other documents,⁸ submissions in this matter may be filed electronically (*i.e.*, through the Commission's Universal Licensing System ("ULS")) or by hand delivery to the Commission.
