ORDER

By the Chief, Enforcement Bureau:

1. In this Order, we adopt a Consent Decree entered into between the Enforcement Bureau (the "Bureau"), STi Telecom Inc. ("STi"),¹ and Progress International, LLC ("Progress"). The Consent Decree terminates an investigation by the Bureau against STi and Progress for possible violations of sections of the Communications Act of 1934, as amended (the "Act") and the Commission's Rules (the "Rules") regarding a substantial transfer of control of international section 214 authority. Specifically, the Consent Decree terminates the Bureau's investigation concerning section 214(a) of the Act² and sections 63.18 and 63.24 of the Rules.³

2. A copy of the Consent Decree negotiated by the Bureau, STi, and Progress is attached hereto and incorporated by reference.

3. After reviewing the terms of the Consent Decree and evaluating the facts before us, we find that the public interest would be served by adopting the Consent Decree and terminating the investigation.

4. In the absence of material new evidence relating to this matter, we conclude that the Bureau's investigation raises no substantial or material questions of fact as to whether STi and Progress

possess the basic qualifications, including those related to character, to hold or obtain a Commission license or authorization.

5. Accordingly, **IT IS ORDERED** that, pursuant to section 4(i) of the Act,⁴ and sections 0.111 and 0.311 of the Commission's Rules,⁵ the Consent Decree attached to this Order **IS ADOPTED**.

6. **IT IS FURTHER ORDERED** that the above-captioned investigation **IS TERMINATED**.
